ORDER DENYING RECONSIDERATION

Petitioner seeks reconsideration of NTSB Order EA-3776 (served February 4, 1993), wherein we denied his petition for review of the denial by the Administrator of the issuance of a first-class airman medical certificate because of his history of hepatitis secondary to sclerosing cholangitis for which petitioner required a liver transplant, and which requires his continued treatment with immunosuppressive medication, including the drug FK-506, which has not yet been approved by the Food and Drug Administration.¹

We have carefully reviewed the petition and find that it is repetitive of arguments previously considered and rejected and that it neither demonstrates error in our original decision nor otherwise provides a valid basis for reconsidering it in any respect.

¹The Administrator has filed a reply to the petition for reconsideration.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

The petitioner's petition for reconsideration of Board Order No. EA-3776 is denied.
