**ORDER DISMISSING PETITION**

Petitioner filed a timely petition for reconsideration of NTSB Order No. EA-5561 (2010), wherein the Board granted, in part, and denied, in part, petitioner’s appeal.<sup>1</sup> This petition for reconsideration, dated July 20, 2012, presents the same arguments we considered and rejected on review of petitioner’s appeal. As a result, the petition is subject to dismissal under 49 C.F.R. § 821.50(d), which states, “[r]epetitious petitions will not be entertained by the Board, and will be summarily dismissed.”

<sup>1</sup> This petition for reconsideration originally was due to the Board in January 2011. However, during that timeframe, petitioner was deployed to Iraq as a member of the Army National Guard. Therefore, under the Servicemembers’ Civil Relief Act, 50 U.S.C. § 522, the petitioner received an extension of time until after completion of his tour of duty to permit him to file this petition.

**ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED THAT:**

Petitioner's petition for reconsideration is dismissed.
