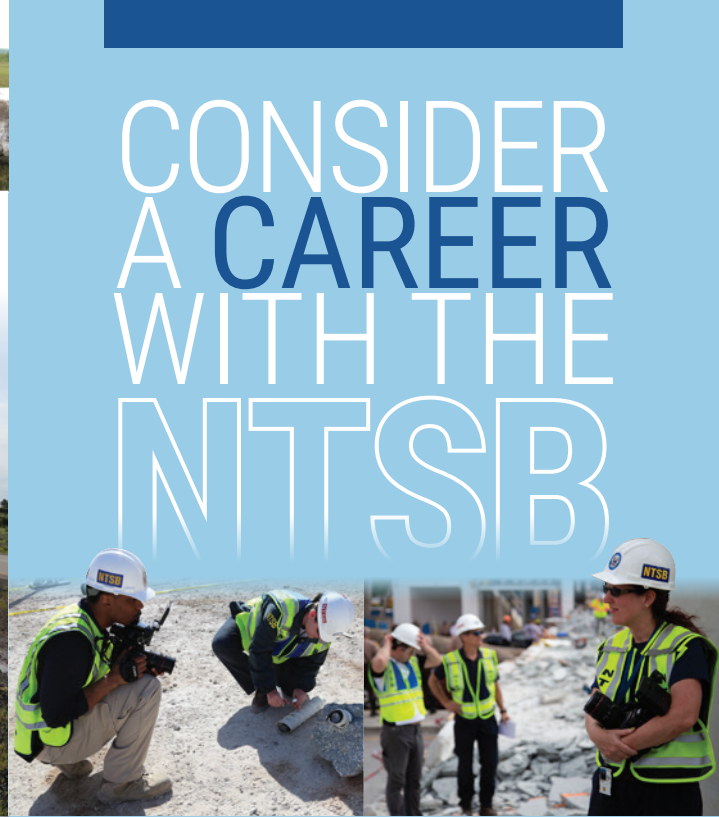

What is the NTSB?

The **National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB)** is an independent federal agency charged by Congress with investigating every civil aviation accident in the United States and significant accidents in other modes of transportation—railroad, highway, marine, and pipeline. The NTSB determines the probable causes of the accidents and issues safety recommendations aimed at preventing their recurrence. In addition, the NTSB carries out special studies concerning transportation safety and coordinates the resources of the federal government and other organizations to provide assistance to victims and their family members impacted by major transportation disasters.

The NTSB has no regulatory or enforcement authority and does not investigate criminal activity. The NTSB does not fall under the Department of Transportation and is not affiliated with the Federal Aviation Administration.

MISSION

Making transportation safer by conducting independent accident investigations, advocating safety improvements, and deciding pilots' and mariners' certification appeals.

LEGISLATIVE MANDATE

Maintaining our congressionally mandated independence and objectivity;

Conducting objective, precise accident investigations and safety studies;

Performing fair and objective airman and mariner certification appeals;

Advocating and promoting safety recommendations;

Assisting victims of transportation accidents and their families.

A majority of opportunities are at the NTSB's headquarters in Washington, D.C. Limited opportunities also exist at the NTSB's regional offices throughout the country.

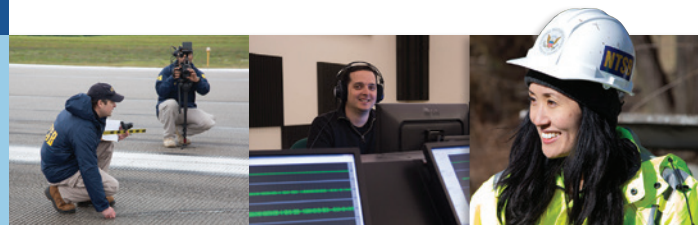
CONSIDER A CAREER IN TRANSPORTATION SAFETY
