ORDER DENYING RECONSIDERATION

Respondent, pro se, seeks reconsideration of NTSB Order No. EA-4509, served December 23, 1996,¹ wherein the Board affirmed the law judge's initial decision and the Administrator's order suspending for 60 days respondent's commercial pilot certificate, his flight instructor certificate, and any other airman certificate held by him, based on his alleged failure, in violation of 14 C.F.R. § 91.195(c), to give required flight instruction before endorsing a student's pilot certificate for solo cross-country flight privileges. We deny the petition.

¹ On January 10, 1997, the Board granted respondent's request for a stay of Order EA-4509, so that he might file a petition for review of that order in the United States Court of Appeals. See NTSB Order No. EA-4519.

In his petition, respondent claims that there were errors of law and fact in Board Order EA-4509. Our review of the record, however, reveals none.² Respondent's petition also repeats arguments that he set forth on appeal. These arguments were thoroughly considered by the Board in connection with its original decision, and nothing in respondent's petition establishes that they, or any other matter raised again therein, merit further discussion.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

The petition for reconsideration is denied.
